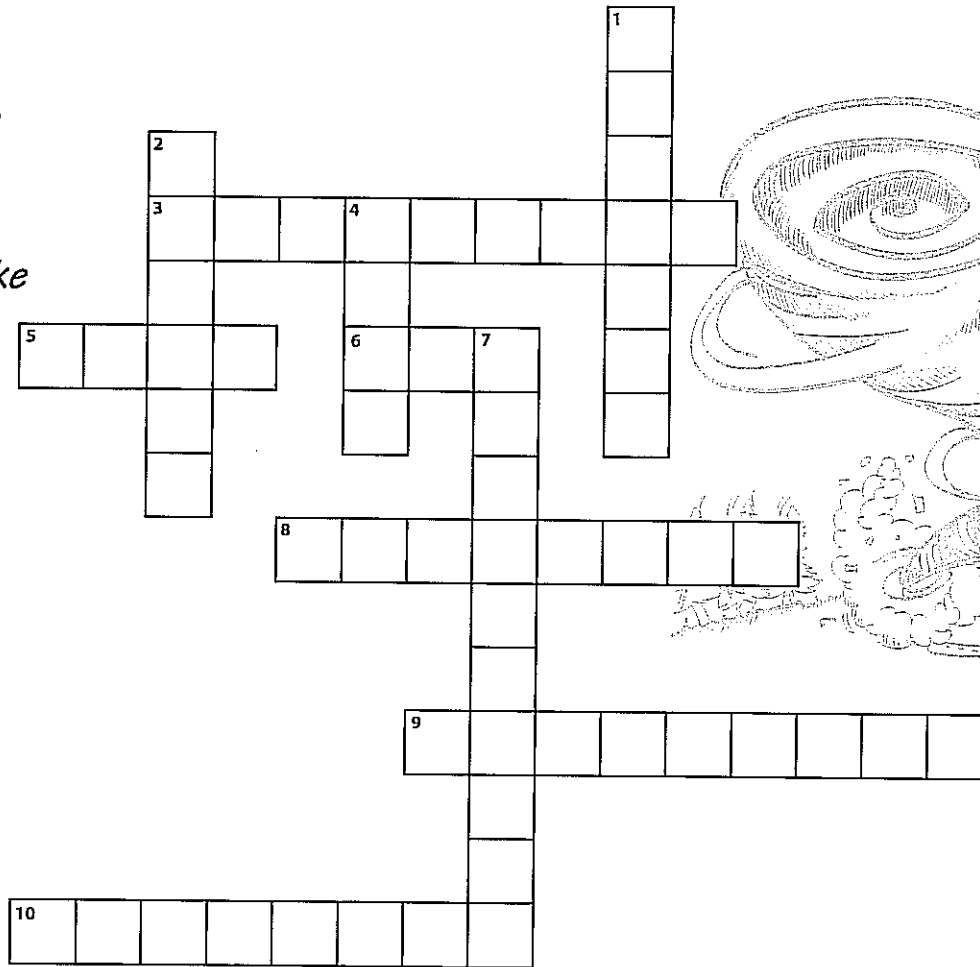
Turn off air and heating systems.

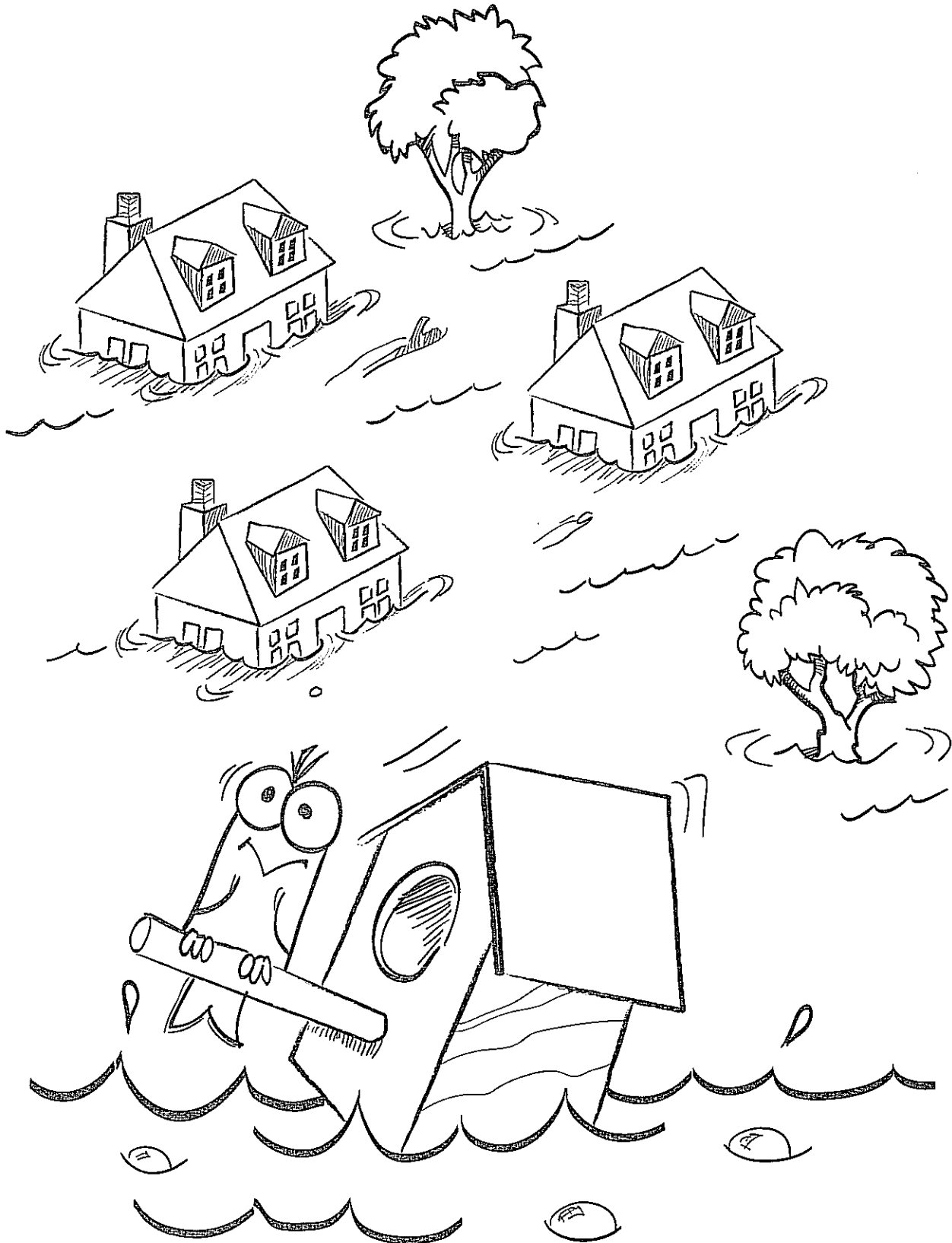

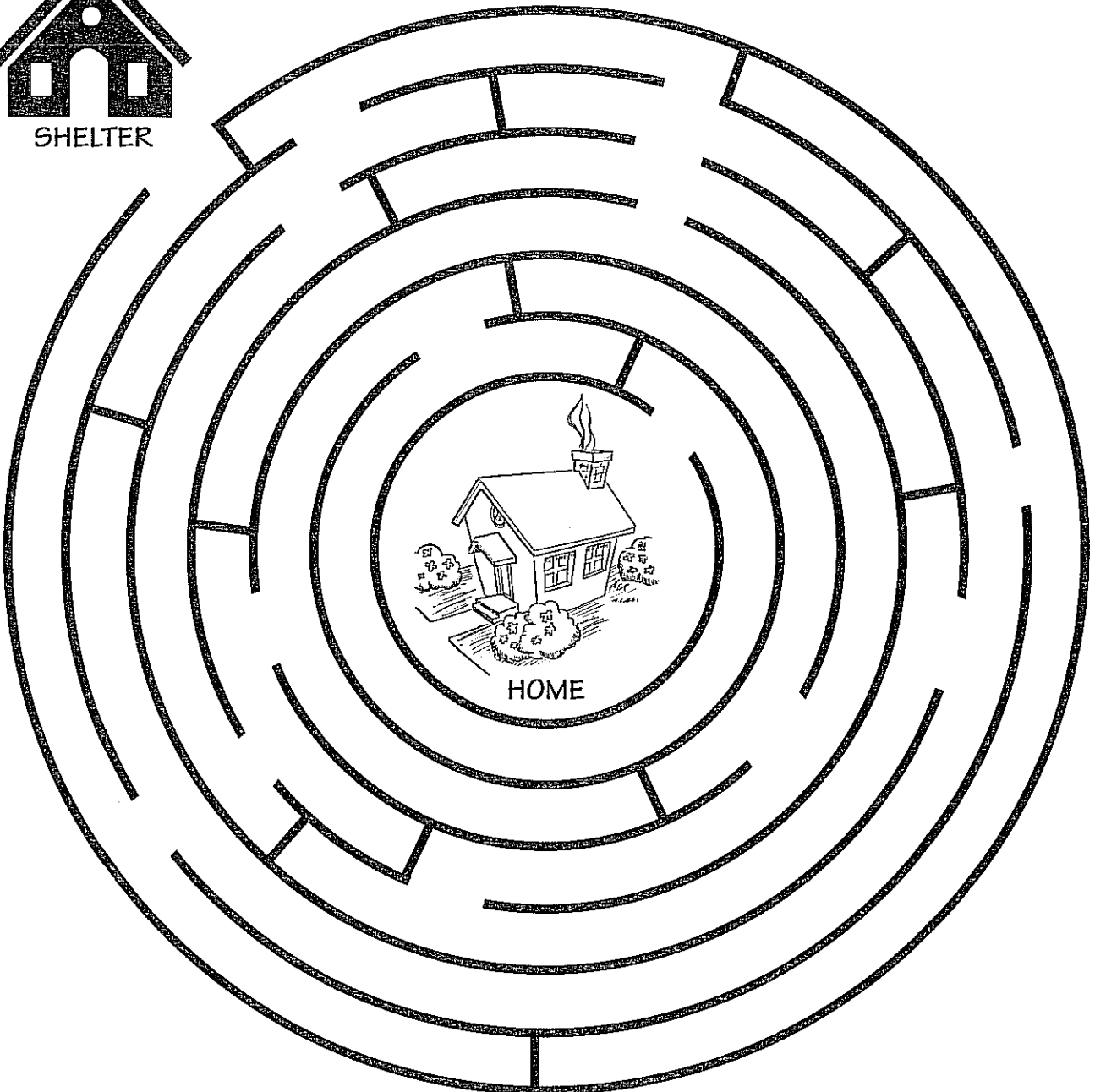

Take a disaster supply kit including water and food.*

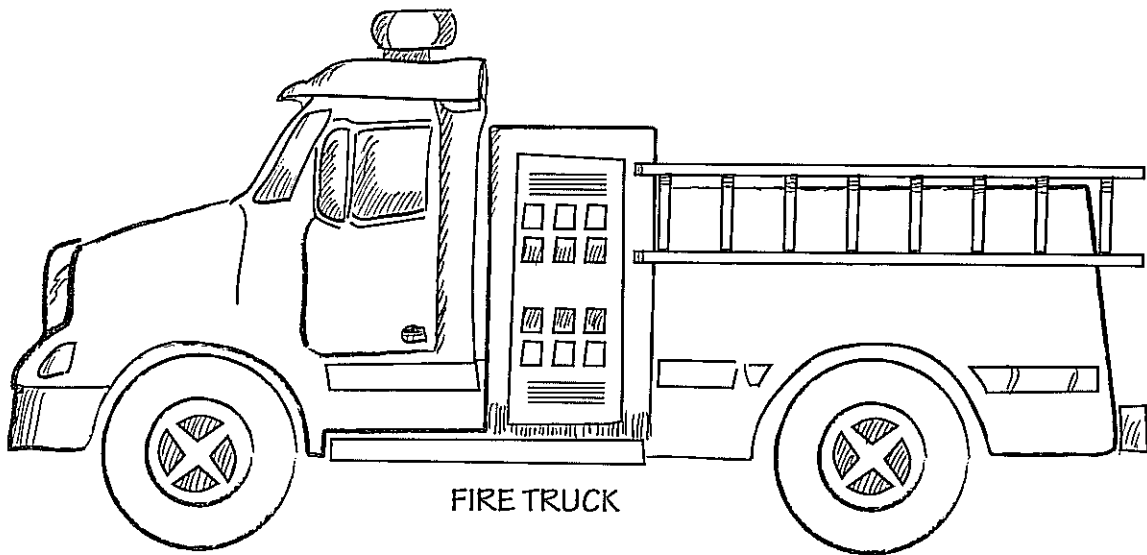

Fire Safety Maze: Know what to do in case of a fire at your house. 1st: Get to a safe place outside of the house. Next, call 911.



Finishing Point:
Mailbox or Tree outside your home



Starting Point:
your bedroom



- Make sure everybody knows what to do in the event of a fire.
- Plan and practice escape routes out of each room.
- Meet your family at a pre-planned place outside the house.
- Install smoke detectors in your home.
- Never open doors if they are hot.
- **STOP, DROP and ROLL** if your clothing catches on fire.

A Disaster Preparedness Kit

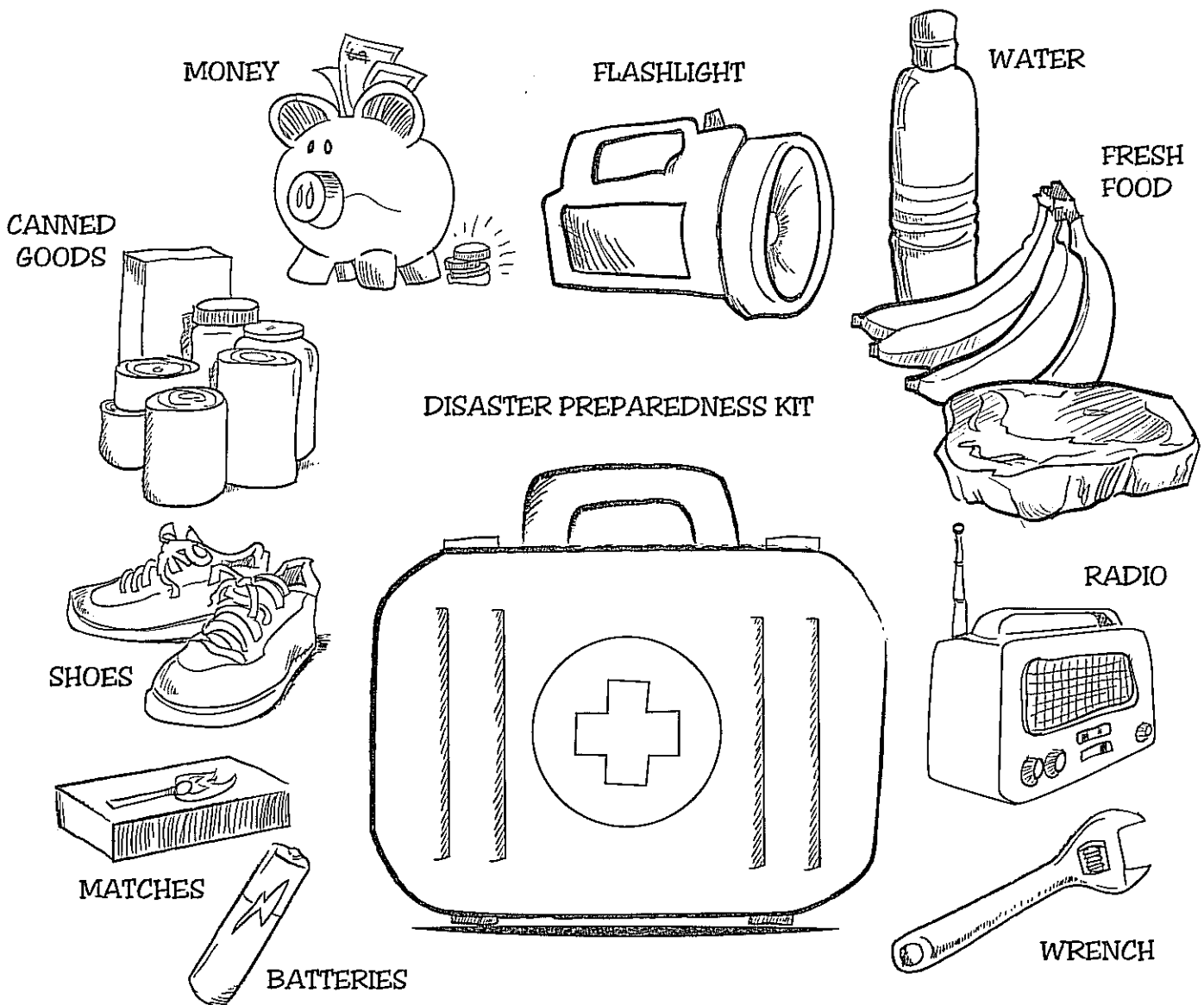
In case of a disaster, this kit will provide your family their basic needs for three days. Every family may not need some of these items.

Keep a three-day supply of water for each family member. Store at least a three-day supply of ready to eat non-perishable food. Include a battery radio, a NOAA weather radio and extra batteries.

Add other items: toilet paper, paper cups, plates, plastic utensils, non-electric can opener, knife, flashlight, matches in waterproof container, a shut-off wrench, money and plastic garbage bags.

Add clothing: rain gear, gloves, sturdy shoes, sleeping bags or blankets, hats and gloves, medicine, family records, books and games.

Assemble a Disaster kit for your home and automobile.

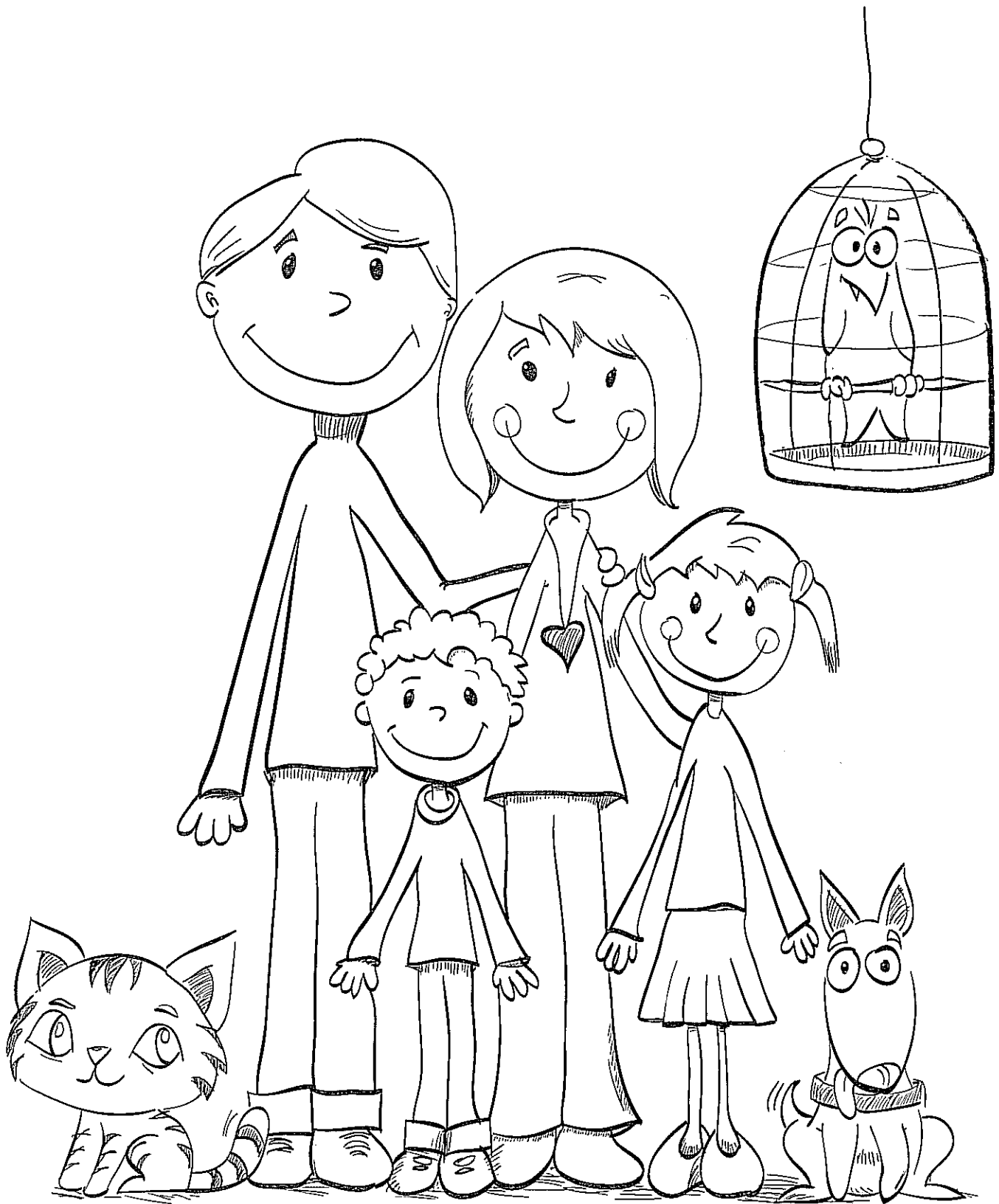

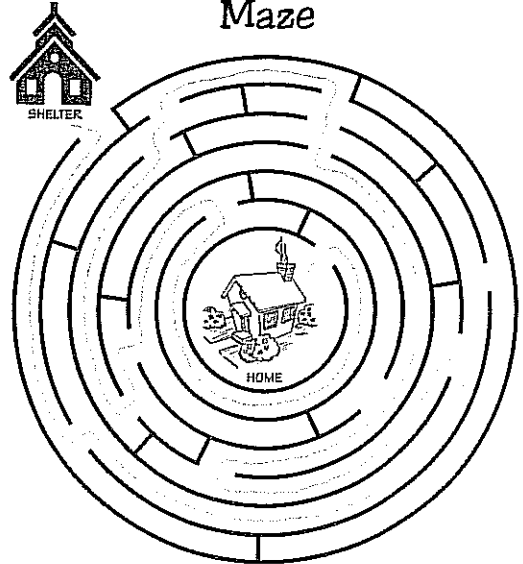

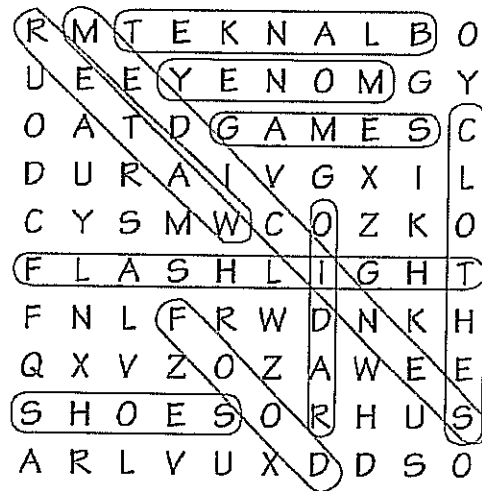
Evacuation Route Maze

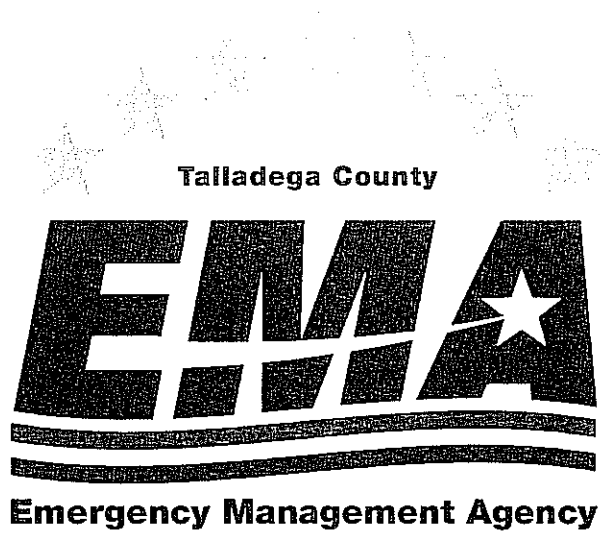
